PROJECT ACTIVITIES DURING COVID-19

The coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic is the defining global health crisis of our time and the greatest challenge we have faced since World War Two. Since its emergence in Asia late last year, the virus has spread to every continent except Antarctica.



Countries are racing to slow the spread of the virus by testing and treating patients, carrying out contact tracing, limiting travel, quarantining citizens, and cancelling large gatherings such as sporting events, concerts, schools and universities. More than 1.5 billion students and youth across the planet are affected by school and university closures due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Two of our project events had to been postponed for September and October 2020: 1st VIRTeach International Workshop in Leuven (initially planned on 27th-28th April 2020) and International Conference on European Transnational Education, ICEUTE, in Burgos (24th-26th June 2020).

















During lock down 25th March 2020 the VIRTEACH consortium organized an online meeting to discuss the most important project activities. Each partner country was represented at least by one participant. We discussed about developing IO2 and organization face to face of international training.



Below you can find information about how our partners have dealt with this difficult situation:

BELGIUM

Belgium took its first steps out of the lockdown that started on the 13th of March. Companies and organisations could take up their activities again, and small stores can open up for customers if they take the necessary precautions. Schools and universities however remain closed until the start of the next academic year.



For teachers and students in Primary and Secondary Education, this poses many challenges and schools hope that certain students will get to return to school this year, so that they can graduate. For students and teachers in Higher Education, the situation brings more work and asks for some flexibility, but in general there are no significant problems. Universities and university colleges getting fully adjusted to online teaching and distance learning for the near future. It's already becoming clear that the current situation will have a lasting impact on Higher Education: e-learning has proven its benefits and will play an increasingly important role in education. The aim of VIRTeach to offer a virtual learning environment perfectly fits this need to bring education online.

ROMANIA

As reported by the UN, the COVID-19 pandemic has touched almost 1.5 billion students forcing school cessations in 191 countries, changing the daily-routine of over 63 million teachers. While UNESCO and partners launched the Global Educational Coalition to produce solutions to "make digital learning more inclusive," aiming at helping countries to gather resources to implement "remote education through hi-tech, low-tech and no-tech approaches," a lot of actors have been holding webinars on the educational challenges and dimension of the pandemic, with participants enrolled from all over the world, from East to West.

The European Association for International Education, through its EAIE Community Moment and EAIE Webinar Academy organized virtual meeting on a range of subjects, COVID19 response, mobilities and international students' recruitment, the regional Francophone center for Central and Easter Europe organized webinars on how to teach online the Francophonic today, the Electronic Platform for Adult Learning in Europe has constantly published updates on distant learning tools or MOOCs courses.

While the webinars discuss strategies to maintain education continuity, considering children and young people in need, presenting to professors and educators a wide variety of tools, there are quite few discussing the pedagogy of online education. Although educators have been sharing debates and exchanging opinions in reference to the e-learning platforms for more than ten years now, this very situation made them found themselves obliged to embrace, at last, the distant online learning. So, from hypothetical, theoretical or, in some happy cases, complementary mode of e-learning platform teaching and learning, we quickly moved to the reality that imposed immediate response, within modern technology tools' use in order to make our students carry on with their studies. And here comes the real challenge! Moving to the e-learning platforms does not mean relocating your lesson from the textbook to an educational e-learning platform, but rather translating pedagogy strategy into tool-adapted, computer-assisted online education that shall surely ease our task to reach the proposed objectives, if we are opened to change! And in times like this, this project and its objectives seems an even more relevant endeavor than it was two years ago.




FIRST VIRTEACH INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOPS IN LEUVEN

Visual Culture and Cultural Interconnections were approached from an interdisciplinary perspective, with a special focus on globalization, linguistic and literary stereotypes and the influence of the English language on minor cultures. As a border city, Tijuana is a mixed culture and language city and it was relevant to the project, to better understand the pivots of second-language acquisition in a bilingual community.


The list of possible topics includes, but is not limited to:

Ramona Mihăilă, Professor Ph.D. and Onorina Botezat, Associate Professor Ph.D., from our partner university in Bucharest, delivered the recorded conference on Literature in the Language Class: Cultural Contexts in Natalie Clifford Barney's Poems, at the Methodological and Psychological Issues of Teaching Foreign Languages International Conference, on 10th April 2020, organized by the School of Foreign Languages, V.N. Karazin Kharkiv National University, Ukraine. The Conference spotlighted consolidation and exchange of innovative technologies in foreign language teaching at higher educational establishments and schools in contemporary educational, psychological and cultural space. Subjects like theory and methodology of foreign language teaching ELT at higher educational establishments and schools, didactic and psychological aspects of FLT at HEIs, or professional training/ development in FLT for ESP are among those discussed.



PRESENTATION OF VIR-TEACH PROJECT AT THE TESOL SPAIN MEETING



7th February 2020, the English Philology team from University of Burgos made a presentation at TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) SPAIN II meeting.

Participants expressed and analyzed their perception of pre-service teacher training in teaching foreign languages, discussed strategies to improve the current situation and created an active pedagogical proposal to improve it. In particular, the participants designed the pedagogical and linguistic foundations of an appropriate tool to improve the tutorial of pre-service teachers through an appropriate instrument that facilitates effective interaction between the school mentor, the university tutor and the future teacher of foreign languages.















Ramona Mihăilă, Professor Ph.D., Onorina Botezat, Associate Professor Ph.D. and MA Paula Alice Băloiu from Romania delivered a paper Approaching Interculturality Through Language and Education" for the third edition of the international conference, organized by the UNESCO Chair in Human Rights Culture and Education for Sustainable Development in Preschool and Primary Education of DCUU, Culture of Peace and Sustainable Development Education in Pre-school and Primary School, 26-28 March 2020. The conference aimed at exploring the influence and further development of the culture of peace and the education for sustainable development in preschool and primary education, capitalizing on research studies in education from the perspective of inter- and transdisciplinarity, disseminating good practices and creating a research community in the field of education.
